## 1.2 General information



- Read this manual carefully.
- Keep the manual and the product information in a safe place for future reference or for the next owner.
- Do not connect the appliance if it has been damaged in transit.

## 1.3 Intended use

Only a licensed professional may connect appliances without plugs. The manufacturer is not responsible for damage caused by incorrect connections. An incorrect connection is not covered by the Statement of Limited Product Warranty.

Only use this appliance:

- For drying and freshening up fabrics that are washed with water and suitable for dryers.
- for normal household use and in enclosed spaces in a residential environment.
- up to an altitude of max. 13,100 ft (4000 m) above sea level.

## 1.4 Restrictive Use

This appliance is not intended for use by persons (including children) with reduced physical, sensory or mental capabilities, or lack of experience and knowledge, unless they have been given supervision or instruction concerning use of the appliance by a person responsible for their safety.

Do not let children play with the appliance.

Cleaning and user maintenance must not be performed by children unless they are being supervised.

Keep children under the age of 3 and pets away from the appliance.

## 1.5 Grounding instructions

This appliance must be grounded. In the event of malfunction or breakdown, grounding will reduce the risk of electric shock by providing a path of least resistance for electric current. This appliance is equipped with a cord having an equipment-grounding conductor. Installation, electrical connections and grounding must comply with all applicable codes.

#### WARNING

Improper connection of the equipment-grounding conductor can result in a risk of electric shock.

Check with a qualified electrician or authorized service representative if you are in doubt whether the appliance is properly grounded.

## 1.6 Safe installation

## WARNING

Incorrect installation is dangerous.

- Connect and operate the appliance only in accordance with the specifications on the rating plate.
- Connect the appliance to a power supply with alternating current only via a correctly installed socket outlet with grounding.



- The protective conductor system of the domestic electrical installation must be properly installed. The installation must have a sufficiently large cable crosssection.
- ► When using a residual current circuit breaker, only use a type with the ark.
- Never equip the appliance with an external switching device, e.g. a timer or remote control.
- Never connect the appliance to a circuit that is regularly switched on and off by the energy supplier.
- When the appliance is installed, the power plug of the power cord must be freely accessible. If free access is not possible, an all-pole isolating switch must be integrated in the permanent electrical installation according to the installation regulations.
- When installing the appliance, check that the power cord is not trapped or damaged.

If the insulation of the power cord is damaged, that can be dangerous.

- Never let the power cord come into contact with hot appliance parts or heat sources.
- Never let the power cord come into contact with sharp points or edges.
- Never kink, crush or modify the power cord.

#### WARNING

## 1.7 Safe use

- Rinse the laundry thoroughly with warm water and detergent before drying it in the machine.
- Do not use the appliance if industrial chemicals have been used to clean the laundry beforehand.

#### WARNING

If drying is interrupted early, the laundry is not cooled sufficiently and may ignite.

- Do not interrupt the drying programme early.
- If drying is interrupted early, remove the laundry immediately and spread it out.

### CAUTION

The covering plate may break if you stand on or climb onto the appliance.

• Do not stand on or climb onto the appliance.

The appliance may tip over if you sit on or lean against the open door.

Reaching into the drum while it is still turning may cause hand injuries.

Wait for the drum to come to a complete stop before reaching inside.

## 1.8 Safe cleaning and maintenance

#### WARNING

## 2 Preventing material damage

#### NOTICE:

The functionality of the appliance may be impaired if you use the wrong quantity of fabric softener, detergent, care product or cleaning agent.

- Follow the dosage recommendations from the manufacturer.
- Only use fabric softeners or products to eliminate static that are specifically recommended for this purpose by the product manufacturer.

Exceeding the maximum load capacity impairs the function of the appliance.

- Observe the maximum load capacity for each programme and do not exceed it.
  - → "Programs", Page 17

The function of the appliance may be impaired if the appliance overheats.

- Keep the ventilation opening on the appliance clear during operation.
- Make sure that the area is adequately ventilated.

Light objects such as hair and lint may be sucked in from the ventilation opening on the appliance during operation and impair the function of the appliance.

- Keep the area around the appliance clean during operation.
- Keep light objects away from the appliance.

If you operate the appliance without a lint guard (e.g. lint screen, lint collector, filter mat, etc., depending on appliance specifications), or if the lint guard is incomplete or defective, this may result in damage to the appliance.

Do not operate the appliance without a lint guard, or with a lint guard that is incomplete or defective.

Foam or foam rubber may deform or melt during the drying process.

► Do not dry laundry that contains foam or foam rubber. Unsuitable cleaning agents may damage the surfaces of the appliance.

## 3 Environmental protection and energy-saving

## 3.1 Disposal of packaging

The packaging materials are environmentally compatible and can be recycled.

 Sort the individual components by type and dispose of them separately.

## 3.2 Saving energy

If you follow these instructions, your appliance will use less power.

Operate the appliance in a well-ventilated room and keep the ventilation opening on the appliance clear.

 If air exchange is impeded, this extends the program duration and increases energy consumption.

Spin the laundry in the washing machine before drying.

 Damper laundry extends the program duration and increases energy consumption.

Observe the program's maximum load capacity.

- If the maximum load is exceeded, this extends the program duration and increases energy consumption.

After drying, clean the lint screen  $\rightarrow$  Page 21.

 If the lint screen is dirty, this reduces the air flow in the appliance, extends the program duration, and increases energy consumption.

Deactivate Wi-Fi on the appliance if it is not being used.

- → "Deactivating Wi-Fi on the appliance", Page 26.
- If the Wi-Fi is activated, this increases energy consumption.

## 3.3 Energy-saving mode

If you do not use the appliance for a brief period, it automatically switches to energy-saving mode. All displays go out and  $\triangleright$  flashes.

Energy-saving mode ends when you use the appliance again.

If you do not use the appliance for an extended period, it automatically switches to standby mode.

## 4 Installation and connection

## 4.1 Unpacking the appliance

#### NOTICE:

Objects remaining in the drum that are not designed for operation with the appliance may cause material damage and damage to the appliance.

- Remove these objects, along with all supplied accessories, from the drum before starting the appliance.
- 1. Remove any packaging and protective covers completely from the appliance.
  - → "Disposal of packaging", Page 8
- 2. Check the appliance for visible damage.
- 3. Open the door.
- 4. Remove any accessories from the drum.

5. Close the door.

## 4.2 Included in delivery

After unpacking all the parts, check for any damage in transit and for completeness of delivery.

## NOTICE:

If the appliance is operated with incomplete or defective accessories, the appliance may not be able to operate properly, or this may result in material damage and damage to the appliance.

- Do not operate the appliance with incomplete or defective accessories.
- Replace the accessories in question before operating the appliance.

## 4.3 Requirements for the installation location

#### NOTICE:

If the appliance is tilted at an angle greater than 40°, residual water may leak out of the appliance and cause material damage.

- Tilt the appliance carefully.
- Transport the appliance in an upright position.

If residual water in the appliance freezes, this may cause damage to the appliance.

 Do not install or operate this appliance anywhere that is liable to experience frost and/or outdoors.

If the appliance is operated immediately after transportation, the refrigerant contained in the appliance may cause damage to the appliance.

Immediately after transporting the appliance, leave it to rest for two hours before putting it into operation.

## 4.4 Installation types

The appliance can be set up in a closed cabinet either in a washer-dryer stack or free-standing.

## **WARNING**

If this appliance is not correctly installed in a washer-dryer stack, the installed appliance may fall.

method is permitted.

## 4.5 Water outlet hose

Condensation that forms in the appliance as it dries the laundry is drained by default into the waste water system using the water outlet hose.

#### Note

- Operate this appliance using the water outlet hose provided.
  - → "Connecting the water outlet hose", Page 10 If you connect the water outlet hose, you do not have to regularly empty the condensation container.
  - → "Emptying the condensation container", Page 23

#### Connecting the water outlet hose

#### NOTICE:

When operating the appliance without the water outlet hose being connected properly, liquid may leak out.

 Before operating the appliance, ensure that the water outlet hose is properly connected.

#### Requirements

- The appliance and the accessory have been unpacked.

- The appliance is installed at the installation location.
  - → "Requirements for the installation location", Page 9
- The water outlet hose is connected to the appliance.
- Connect the appliance to the water outlet.

#### Water outlet connection types

#### NOTICE:

In the event of a blocked or covered outlet, accumulated wastewater can flow back into the appliance.

 Before operating the appliance, ensure that the wastewater drains away quickly and eliminate any blockages.

Drainage into a siphon.



Secure the connection point with a (1/2"-7/8" (12-22 mm)) hose clamp. Secure the water outlet hose with a hose guide at a height of at least 31 1/2" (80 cm) and no more than 39 3/8" (100 cm). **Note:** You can use the Y-

distributor  $\rightarrow$  Page 20 to connect the water outlet hose of an additional appliance, such as a washing machine, to the same siphon outlet.

Drainage into a washbasin.



Push the water outlet hose fully through the elbow and secure it using fixing material. Secure the elbow at a height of no more than 39 3/8" (100 cm).

Drainage into a gully.



Push the water outlet hose fully through the elbow and secure it using fixing material. Secure the elbow to the gully.

## 4.6 Connecting the condensation container

During the drying cycle, condensation forms; you can use the water outlet hose to drain away this condensation directly into the waste water system. If this is not possible at the appliance's installation location, connect the condensation container.

**Note:** Operate this appliance using the water outlet hose provided.

→ "Connecting the water outlet hose", Page 10

If you connect the water outlet hose, you do not have to regularly empty the condensation container.

→ "Emptying the condensation container", Page 23

#### NOTICE:

When operating the appliance without the water outlet hose being connected properly, liquid may leak out.

 Before operating the appliance, ensure that the water outlet hose is properly connected.

#### Requirements

- The appliance and the accessory have been unpacked.

- 1. Empty the condensation container. → Page 23
- 2. Remove the stopper from the recess in the top ① and insert it in the underside ②.



When the appliance is delivered, the stopper is included as an accessory in the scope of delivery.

- **3.** Insert the condensation container.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 24*
- 4. Connect the water outlet hose on the rear of the appliance to the condensation container.



**Tip:** To go back to using the water outlet hose to drain the condensation into the waste water system (e.g. if you change where the appliance is located), carry out these steps in reverse order.

## 4.7 Aligning the appliance

In order to reduce noise and vibrations, align the appliance correctly.

• To align the appliance, turn the appliance feet. Check that the appliance is level using a spirit level.



All appliance feet must stand firmly on the ground.

### 4.8 Connecting the appliance to the electricity supply

1. Insert the power adapter with the line side into a suitable socket close to the appliance.

Observe the user manual that is enclosed with the power adapter.

2. Insert the mains plug for the appliance's power cord into the power adapter's load side.

The connection details of the appliance can be found under Technical data  $\rightarrow$  *Page 34*.

3. Check the power plug is inserted properly.

## 5.3 Operating logic

Some areas of the display are buttons and respond to touch. You can activate, deactivate or change settings by pressing the buttons. The activated settings are highlighted brightly on the display.

#### NOTICE:

- Pressing on the display with force may cause damage.
- Do not apply heavy pressure on the display.
- Do not press on the display using pointed or sharp objects.

#### Changing a setting value

If you activate certain settings, the display shows selection buttons and you can change the setting value.

## 8 Programs

You can dry your fabrics using either an automatic program or a timed program.

## 8.1 Automatic programs

Automatic programs are programs in which humidity sensors measure the residual moisture in the laundry during the drying cycle. The program only ends once the set dryness level is reached.

Each automatic program has a dryness level  $\rightarrow$  *Page 24*. The dryness level defines how dry or damp your laundry is after the program ends.

#### Tips

- Select the dryness level according to the type of fabric or the desired drying result.
  - → "Dryness level", Page 24
- The laundry's care labels provide you with additional information on program selection.

## 8.2 Timed programs

Timed programs are programs with a defined or adjustable program duration. The program ends once this time has elapsed, even if the laundry is still not dry, for example. Timed programs are suitable for drying individual items of laundry or thin fabrics.

## 10 Laundry

#### 10.1 Preparing the laundry

#### NOTICE:

Objects remaining in the laundry may damage the laundry and the drum.

 Remove all items from any pockets in your laundry before using the appliance.

#### Note

The appliance and fabrics are protected when you prepare your laundry.

- Brush off sand and soil
- Sort the laundry according to color and fabrics and observe the care labels
- Close all zippers, hook and loop fasteners, hooks and eyes
- Remove curtain fittings and lead strips
- Load the laundry unfolded into the drum
- Spin the laundry before drying
- Dry woolen items, sports shoes and soft toys in the wool basket

## **11 Basic Operation**

## 11.1 Switching on the appliance

**Note:** If you switch the appliance on the first time after you have connected it to the electrical system, the switch-on process takes up to one minute.

**Requirement:** The appliance has been correctly installed and connected.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 8* 

► Press <sup>(1)</sup>.

The switch-on process takes a few seconds.

Note: The lighting for the drum goes out automatically.

#### 11.2 Setting a program

## 1. Press the required program.

## → "Programs", Page 17



- The display shows the program settings.
- 2. Adjust the program settings.
  - → "Buttons", Page 16
  - Observe the information about operating logic
  - *→ Page 14*.

The program settings are not saved permanently for the program.

## 11.3 Saving the program settings

You can save your individual program settings as favorites.

**Requirement:** A program has been set. → *Page 20* 

Press and hold Favorite for approximately 3 seconds.
 Press Favorite to call up the saved program.

**Note:** To overwrite the saved program, repeat the steps above.

## 11.4 Loading laundry

**Note:** To prevent creasing, note the maximum load for the programs.

→ "Programs", Page 17

## Requirements

- The laundry is prepared and sorted.
- → "Laundry", Page 20
- The drum is empty.
- 1. Open the door.
- 2. Place the laundry in the drum.
- 3. Close the door.

Ensure that there is no laundry trapped in the door.

## 11.5 Starting the program

**Requirement:** A program has been set. → *Page 20* 

- ► Press || ▷.
- The display shows the program duration or the program end time.

After the program has ended, the display shows: "End".

**Note:** When "Hot" is shown on the display, the appliance cools the laundry.

When "Hot" goes out, the laundry has cooled down.

## 11.6 Adding laundry

After the program starts, you can remove or add laundry at any time.

**1.** Press || ▷.

The cooling process starts automatically after approximately 30 seconds and cools down the laundry while the drum is rotating. If you want to avoid or cancel the cooling process, open the door.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 15* 

- 2. Open the door.
- 3. Add or remove laundry.
- 4. Close the door.
- **5.** Press∥⊵.

## 11.7 Terminating the program

- **1.** Press || ▷.
- 2. Open the door.
- 3. Remove the laundry.  $\rightarrow$  Page 21

## 11.8 Removing the laundry

- 1. Open the door.
- 2. Remove the laundry from the drum.

## 11.9 Put the appliance into standby mode

► Press 心.

## 11.10 Lint screen

During drying, lint from the laundry is collected in the lint screen. The lint screen protects the appliance from lint.

#### **Cleaning the lint screen**

If the drying program has finished or the display shows a notification while the appliance is in operation, clean the lint screen.

**Note:** If you do not clean the appliance as described, the appliance's functionality may be impaired.

#### Requirements

- The display shows the following after drying: "End"
- or the display shows the following during operation: <sup>((()</sup>)
- 1. Open the door.

2. Remove the lint from the door.



3. Remove the two-part lint screen.



4. Remove the lint from the recess.



Ensure that no lint falls into the air channel.

5. Disconnect the two-part lint screen.



6. Open the two lint screens.



7. Remove the lint.



8. Clean the two lint screens thoroughly under warm, running water and then dry them off.



9. Close the two lint screens and put them together.



10. Insert the two-part lint screen.



11. Close the door.

### 11.11 Condensation container

If you have connected the condensation container, your appliance uses this to collect any condensation.

**Note:** Operate this appliance using the water outlet hose provided.

→ "Connecting the water outlet hose", Page 10 If you connect the water outlet hose, you do not have to regularly empty the condensation container.

→ "Emptying the condensation container", Page 23

#### Emptying the condensation container

If the drying program has finished or the display shows a notification while the appliance is in operation, empty the condensation container.

#### Requirements

- The display shows the following after drying: "End"
- or the display shows the following during operation: <u></u>
- 1. Pull out the condensation container, keeping it level.



2. Empty the condensation container.



Check the condensation container filter regularly, and clean the filter if it is dirty.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 29* Make sure that you insert the condensation container before operating the appliance.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 24* 

#### Inserting the condensation container

• Push the condensation container in as far as it will go.



## 12 Dryness level

Each automatic program has a specified dryness level. The dryness level defines how dry or damp your laundry is after the program ends.

## 12.1 Changing the dryness level

For some automatic programs, you can change the dryness level so that your laundry will be drier or more damp.

- **1.** Set an automatic program.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 17*
- The display shows the specified dryness level.
- 2. Press Dry, Extra Dry, or Iron Dry.

## 12.2 Adjusting the dryness level

If the laundry feels too damp after it has been dried to a particular dryness level, you can adjust the dryness level.

**Note:** You can also adjust the dryness level in the basic settings.

- **1.** Set an automatic program.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 17*
- The display shows the specified dryness level.
- 2. Press and hold **Dry**, **Extra Dry** or **Iron Dry** for approximately 3 seconds.
- **3.** Press  $\land$  or  $\checkmark$  to adjust the dryness level.

4. Press and hold the selected dryness level for approximately 3 seconds to return to the automatic program.

## 13 Control panel lock

Secure your appliance against being operated unintentionally using the controls.

## 13.1 Activating the control panel lock

- Press and hold C 3 Sec. for around 3 seconds.
- ✓ The control elements are locked.
- The control panel lock also remains activated when the appliance is in standby mode and in the event of a power failure.

## 13.2 Deactivating the control panel lock

**Requirement:** To deactivate the control panel lock, the appliance must be switched on.

Press and hold Cm 3 Sec. for around 3 seconds.

## 14 Crease-removal function

In order to reduce creasing and airborne odors, such as cigarette smoke, you can use a program with a creaseremoval function for any dry laundry that has not been worn for long or at all.

#### 14.1 Starting a program with the creaseremoval function

#### Note

Wash items of laundry that have traces of sweat, perfume or deodorant before wearing them again.

Do not use dryer cleaning sets.

Do not use a program with the crease-removal function for the following fabrics:

- Wool, leather, and viscose
- Fabrics with parts made from metal, wood, or plastic
- Waxed jackets and oilskin jackets

**Requirement:** The laundry is placed in the appliance.

- → Page 21
- **1.** Set a program with crease-removal function.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 17*
- **2.** Start the program.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 21*

If the water tank is empty, the display shows:  $\Leftrightarrow$ .  $\rightarrow$  "Filling the water tank", Page 25

The average program duration of the crease-removal function is approx. 45 minutes and may be longer or shorter depending on the ambient temperature.

- After the program has ended, the display shows: "End".
- **3.** Remove the laundry.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 21*

The results of the crease-removal function may vary depending on the type of fabric, the amount of laundry, and the selected program.

Remove the laundry immediately after the program has ended to prevent creasing.

4. Hang up the items of laundry and pull them into shape.

### 14.2 Filling the water tank

Your appliance removes the creases from rarely worn clothing using cold mains water. If the display shows a notification while the appliance is in operation, fill the water tank.

#### NOTICE:

Operating the appliance with water that is dirty or too hot may result in damage to the appliance.

- Only fill the water tank with cold drinking water.
- Never use condensed water, distilled water, additives or descaler for the crease-removal function.

#### Requirements

- A program with the crease-removal function has been started. → Page 24
- The display shows: ↔.
- The condensation container → Page 23 is removed from the appliance.
- **1.** Add approx. 6.1 fl oz (180 ml) cold mains water through the front opening, using the water jug provided.



Check the water tank filter regularly and clean the filter if it is dirty.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 29* 

If  $\Leftrightarrow$  does not go out on the display, add cold drinking water through the front opening and align the appliance correctly.

- → "Aligning the appliance", Page 12
- $\Leftrightarrow$  goes out on the display.
- 2. Insert the condensation container.  $\rightarrow$  Page 24
- **3.** Start the program.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 21*

## **15 Home Connect®**

This appliance is network-capable. Connecting your appliance to a mobile device lets you control its functions via the Home Connect® app, adjust its basic settings and monitor its operating status.

The Home Connect® services are not available in every country. The availability of the Home Connect® function depends on the availability of Home Connect® services in your country. You can find information on this at: www.home-connect.com.

The Home Connect® app guides you through the entire registration process. Follow the instructions in the Home Connect® app to implement the settings.

**Tip:** Follow the instructions in the Home Connect® app as well.

#### Notes

- Also note the safety information in this instruction manual and ensure that it is also observed when operating the appliance using the Home Connect<sup>®</sup> app.
   → "Safety", Page 4
- Operating the appliance on the appliance itself always takes priority. It is not possible to operate the appliance using the Home Connect® app during this time.

## 15.1 Setting up the Home Connect® app

- 1. Install the Home Connect® app on your mobile device.
- 2. Start the Home Connect® app and set up access for Home Connect®.

The Home Connect® app guides you through the entire registration process.

## 15.2 Setting up Home Connect®

#### Requirements

- The Home Connect<sup>®</sup> app is installed on your mobile device.
- The appliance receives signals from the WLAN home network (Wi-Fi) at its installation location.
- 1. Press and hold **Remote Start** for around 3 seconds.
- 2. Follow the instructions in the Home Connect® app.

## 15.3 Activating Wi-Fi on the appliance

- 1. Press and hold Remote Start for around 3 seconds.
- 2. Press **Remote Start** repeatedly until the display shows "oFF".
- **3.** Press  $\square \triangleright$  to activate the Wi-Fi.
- The display shows "on".

#### Notes

- If the Wi-Fi is activated, the display alternately shows "on" and the signal strength of the Wi-Fi connection.
- To exit the Home Connect® settings, press and hold Remote Start for approx. 3 seconds.

## 15.4 Deactivating Wi-Fi on the appliance

- 1. Press and hold **Remote Start** for around 3 seconds.
- Press Remote Start repeatedly until the display shows "on".
- 3. Press  $|| \triangleright$  to deactivate the Wi-Fi.
- The display shows "oFF".

**Note:** To exit the Home Connect® settings, press and hold **Remote Start** for approx. 3 seconds.

## 15.5 Installing a software update

**Note:** If a software update is available, a message appears in the Home Connect® app.

- To install the software update, follow the instructions in the Home Connect® app.
- The control panel is partially locked during the installation.
- In the event of a malfunction, installation may take up to 40 minutes. Do not reset the network settings or the appliance to the factory settings.

## 15.6 Resetting the appliance network settings

- 1. Press and hold **Remote Start** for around 3 seconds.
- 2. Press **Remote Start** repeatedly until the display shows "rES".
- 3. Press and hold  $|| \triangleright$  for around 3 seconds.
- The network settings are reset.

## 15.7 Remote start

Enable the appliance for remote start via the Home Connect® app.

#### Note

Remote start will be deactivated in the following circumstances:

- The appliance door is opened.
- Press || ▷.
- Press Remote Start.
- Following a power failure.

#### Activating remote start

#### Requirements

- The appliance door is closed.
- The refresher tank is not empty.
- Press Remote Start.
- Remote Start lights up and the appliance is enabled for remote start via the Home Connect® app.

#### **Deactivating remote start**

- Press Remote Start.
- Remote Start goes out.

## 15.8 Intelligent program recommendation

When you activate the intelligent program recommendation, your appliance recommends a suitable program for drying the laundry once you have washed your laundry in the washing machine.

## Activating the intelligent program recommendation Requirements

- Your washing machine has the Home Connect® function.
- Your washing machine and your dryer must be connected to your home network and registered in your Home Connect<sup>®</sup> app.
- 1. Press D SmartDry.
- The appliance determines a suitable program. To cancel the process, set a different program or switch the appliance to standby mode.
- If the appliance finds a suitable program, the display for the program lights up and the program information is displayed.
- If the appliance does not find a suitable program, a signal tone sounds and the display shows "- --".
- **2**. Press || ▷.

## 15.9 Remote diagnostics

The Customer Service can access your appliance via Remote Diagnostics if you ask them to do so, if your appliance is connected to the Home Connect® server and if Remote Diagnostics is available in the country where you are using the appliance.

## 15.10 Data Protection

Please see the information on data protection. The first time your appliance is registered on a home network connected to the Internet, your appliance will transmit the following types of data to the Home Connect® server (initial registration):

- Unique appliance identification (consisting of appliance codes as well as the MAC address of the installed Wi-Fi communication module).
- Security certificate of the Wi-Fi communication module (to ensure a secure data connection).
- The current software and hardware version of your appliance.
- Status of any previous reset to factory settings.

This initial registration prepares the Home Connect® functions for use and is only required when you want to use the Home Connect® functions for the first time.

## 17.1 Preparing for the appliance care program

## Preparing the appliance for the appliance care program

Prepare the appliance before running the appliance care program.

- The drum is empty.
- The appliance is in standby mode.
- **1.** Clean the lint screen.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 21*
- Pull out the condensation container horizontally and empty it. → Page 23

## Preparing the condensation container for the appliance care program

If you are draining the condensation water from the appliance using the drain hose, prepare the condensation container before running the appliance care program.

 Remove the stopper from the recess in the top ① and insert it in the underside ②.



When the appliance is delivered, the stopper is included as an accessory in the scope of delivery.

2. Clean the filter in the condensation container.

## 17.2 Calling up the appliance care program

Requirement: The appliance care program is ready.

- *→ Page 27*
- **1. Press** 也.

The switch-on process takes a few seconds.

- 2. Press Basic Settings.
- 3. Set the program to position 5.
- "CP1" and the program duration alternate on the display.

## 17.3 Running the basic appliance care program

To remove light dirt deposits in the appliance, you can run the basic appliance care program.

#### Notes

- The basic appliance care program runs for approximately 1 hour.
- After a lengthy period of use, the appliance reminds you to run the basic appliance care program. Before the program starts or after the program has ended, the display shows the notification "CArE". This notification appears repeatedly until you have run the basic appliance care program through to the end.

#### Requirements

- The appliance care program is ready. → Page 27
- The appliance care program is called up. → Page 27
- 1. Pour approx. 6.3 cups (1.5 l) of hot mains water into the condensation container.

Hold the filled condensation container level so that no liquid spills out.

- 2. Insert the condensation container so that it locks into place.
- **3**. Press || ▷.
- The appliance care program starts and a signal tone sounds.
- "End" appears on the display and a signal tone sounds once the appliance care program has ended.
- 4. Pull out the condensation container horizontally and empty it.
- If you drain the condensation using the drain hose, remove the stopper from the underside of the condensation container and insert it into the recess in the top of the condensation container. → Page 27
- 6. Insert the condensation container so that it locks into place.
- 7. Put the appliance into standby mode.  $\rightarrow$  Page 21

## 17.4 Running the intensive appliance care program

You can run the intensive appliance care program to remove any stubborn dirt deposits in the appliance and odors after a downtime of more than one month.

#### Notes

- The intensive appliance care program runs for approximately 4 hours and must not be canceled.
- When you run the intensive appliance care program, you need the original appliance care product
   → Page 20.

#### Starting the intensive appliance care program Requirements

- The appliance care program is ready.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 27*
- The appliance care program is called up. → Page 27

- 1. Press 🗸.
- "CP2" and the program duration alternate on the display.
- Pour a bottle of the appliance care product and approx.
   6.3 cups (1.5 l) of hot mains water into the condensation container.

Hold the filled condensation container level so that no liquid spills out.

- **3.** Insert the condensation container so that it locks into place.
- **4.** Press || ▷.
- The appliance care program starts and a signal tone sounds.
- After around 3 hours, the appliance pauses the appliance care program and the remaining program duration flashes on the display.
- 5. Pull out the condensation container horizontally and empty it.
- **6.** Pour approx. 6.3 cups (1.5 l) of hot mains water into the condensation container.
- **7.** Carefully swivel the condensation container horizontally and empty it to rinse out any remaining appliance care product.

#### Continuing the intensive appliance care program

**1.** Pour approx. 6.3 cups (1.5 l) of hot mains water into the condensation container.

Hold the filled condensation container level so that no liquid spills out.

- 2 Insert the condensation container so that it locks into place.
- **3.** Press || ▷.
- ✓ The appliance care program continues.
- "End" appears on the display and a signal tone sounds once the appliance care program has ended.
- **4.** Pull out the condensation container horizontally and empty it.
- If you drain the condensation using the drain hose, remove the stopper from the underside of the condensation container and insert it into the recess in the top of the condensation container. → Page 27
- 6. Insert the condensation container so that it locks into place.
- 7. Put the appliance into standby mode.  $\rightarrow$  Page 21

## 18 Cleaning and maintenance

To keep your appliance working efficiently for a long time, it is important to clean and maintain it carefully.

## 18.1 Water tank filter

The filter in the water tank protects the appliance from dirt and contaminants.

### Cleaning the water tank filter

Check the filter regularly and clean the filter if it is dirty.

**Requirement:** The condensation container  $\rightarrow$  *Page 23* is removed from the appliance.

1. Pull out the filter.



- 2. Clean the filter under warm, running water or in the dishwasher.
- 3. Insert the filter.



4. Insert the condensation container.  $\rightarrow$  Page 24

## 18.2 Moisture sensor

The moisture sensor in this appliance measures how damp the laundry is during the drying cycle. The appliance changes the duration of the automatic program depending on the residual moisture in the laundry.

#### Cleaning the moisture sensor

Over time, residue from limescale, detergents, and care products can build up on the moisture sensor. Clean the moisture sensor regularly.

### NOTICE:

Hard or rough objects may damage the moisture sensor.

 Do not use hard or rough objects, abrasive cleaning products, or steel wool for cleaning.

**Note:** If you do not clean the appliance as described, the appliance's functionality may be impaired.

- 1. Open the door.
- 2. Clean the moisture sensor with a sponge.



## 18.3 Condensation container filter

During drying, lint from the laundry gets into the condensation. The filter in the condensation container protects the appliance from lint.

## Cleaning the condensation container filter

The filter is cleaned automatically when the condensation container is emptied. Check the filter regularly and clean the filter if it is dirty.

**1.** Empty the condensation container.  $\rightarrow$  *Page 23* 

2. Remove the filter.



- **3.** Clean the filter under warm, running water or in the dishwasher.
- 4. Slide in the filter as far as it will go.



5. Insert the condensation container.  $\rightarrow$  Page 24

## **19 Troubleshooting**

You can eliminate minor issues on your appliance yourself. Please read the information on eliminating issues before contacting Customer Service. This may avoid unnecessary repair costs.

## **WARNING**

Improper repairs are dangerous.

 Never make any technical modifications to the appliance or its features.

- Do not tamper with controls.
- Repairs to the appliance should only be performed by authorized service providers.
- Only original spare parts may be used to repair the appliance.
- If the power cord of this appliance becomes damaged, it must be replaced by the manufacturer, the manufacturer's Customer Service, or an authorized service provider in order to prevent injury.
